



Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT)

A full-time, three-year professional degree program (101 credit hours)

PROGRAM PREREQUISITES

- Completion of a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution, prior to matriculation.
- A grade of "C" or above is required for all prerequisite courses.
- Anatomy & Physiology courses must be less than 5 years old at the time of application. All other prerequisite courses must be taken within 10 years of application submission.
- On-site labs are required for anatomy, and preferred for all other science courses.
- Advanced placement credits are accepted for prerequisite courses except for human anatomy, human physiology, physics and chemistry.
- No more than 3 outstanding prerequisite courses at the time of application.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- Two letters of reference, which must come from a licensed practicing physical therapist and a college professor (preferred science or professor in major).
- A minimum of 40 documented hours (volunteer or paid) of exposure to physical therapy practice under the supervision of a licensed physical therapist.
- Take the Graduate Record Examination (GRE). No minimum score required to apply.
- Language Proficiency requirement must be met. Submission of TOEFL, IELTS, PTE, or Duolingo English Test may be required. See our policy for full details: <https://www.su.edu/admissions/international-students>
