May include clinical practice, research, or leadership mentorship and collaborations.
Supervision Criteria	Currently licensed occupational therapists or occupational therapy assistants, and licensed professionals such as psychologists, physician assistants, teachers, social workers, nurses, and physical therapists	Currently licensed occupational therapist who has a minimum of 1 year full-time (or its equivalent) practice experience subsequent to initial certification and who is adequately prepared to serve as a fieldwork educator	Mentor with expertise consistent with the student's area of focus (does not have to be an occupational therapist), along with faculty advisor; a Licensed OT must provide 8 hours of mentorship per week
Evaluation	SU Level I Fieldwork Evaluation of Student Performance	AOTA Fieldwork Performance Evaluation (FWPE) for the Occupational Therapy Students	Individualized learning contract with specific objectives, plans for supervision/mentoring, and responsibilities of all parties
